UCEM update



Our strategic aim to become **the centre of excellence for built environment education**

remains the focus of our activities and our positive institutional performance through the pandemic has endured into 2021-22. We continue to manage our finances to budget and have outperformed our targets on **new student recruitment** and retention through both the autumn and spring semesters, recruiting 1,473 vs a target of 1,400 for the year with our apprenticeship provision now accounting for over half of the UCEM student population. A vital part of the apprenticeship work is the strong relationships that we have built with key employers in the sector. In total UCEM now has circa 3,700 students. As you may well have seen, this part of our business became subject to **Ofsted** inspections last year and we received our first fully graded inspection of this provision in November 2021. The results were published in January 2022, and we were simply delighted to receive an overall grading

of 'good' with some elements of our provision commended as 'outstanding'. We also underwent an audit by the Education and Skills Funding **Agency** of our apprenticeship funding compliance in December 2021 which UCEM passed with flying colours, once again providing the accreditation the institution deserves and paving the way for us to continue to grow our provision for the future. These amazing results are entirely down to our exceptionally talented and hardworking staff and their commitment to excellence in all they do. We hosted the first ever **Built Environment Apprenticeship Awards** back in February 2022 and were delighted to honour three very worthy winners in the categories of Employer Representative of the Year, Apprentice of the Year and UCEM Staff Member of the Year. Our application for Indefinite Degree Awarding
Powers remains in progress. The desk-based
assessment by the Quality Assurance Agency has
now been completed and UCEM is awaiting the final
judgement of the Office for Students. We hope to be
able to make an announcement later in 2022 and
still aim for this to be springboard towards applying
for full university title.



We held our first **Board of Trustees** meeting of 2022 in person on 31st March at Horizons and at this we approved an ambitious new programme of work in the area of **sustainability**. UCEM will be shifting its strategic focus towards sustainability goals over the coming years and will be launching new initiatives and programmes to help us become the **worlds most sustainable university**. The Board also discussed at length the higher education landscape and the increasing regulatory burden being placed on the institution. This burden is disproportionate for an institution the size of UCEM and places growing operational and resource requirements on us which we continue to strive to meet.

We were sorry to lose two independent trustees from our Board on 31st March, Andrew Hynard and Wendy Appleby, who retired and concluded their terms of office with us. We are incredibly grateful for the time they gave us and the expertise they shared with us and wish them well for the future. We are now actively recruiting for trustees to join the Board to work with us on achieving our ambitions over the next six years. Information on the roles and how to apply are available at

The board is committed to diversity and equality of representation around the table, and we operate inclusively and with a variety of voices - including two student trustees, two staff trustees and two Board Apprentices. We also welcomed a new trustee to the board in the last quarter, Dominic O'Rourke, Property Director at Next Plc.

In this edition we meet Tim Stapleton, part of the class of 1966 on the BSc Estate Management London Degree course at St Alban's Grove Kensington, a UCEM Honorary Fellow since 2005, and David Mason, UCEM's first ever Student Trustee and one of the first cohort of UCEM Associate Fellows appointed in 2019. We asked them both some questions to help us get to know them and learn more about their connection to UCEM.

Tim Stapleton (Honorary Fellow)

How are you connected to UCEM?

In the 1960s only 5% of young people went to University. I was lucky in 1966 to be the last entry to the London University BSc Est Man at St Albans Grove, Kensington. Later I was a Trustee for 15 years at Reading, also taught on courses around the country and became an Honorary Fellow in 2005.

What are you doing now?

I'm now retired, living in deepest West Devon in the Lyd Valley. When I retired from King Sturge (JLL) I had ten years as a non-exec director with educational charities. I have also written a book, Sailing from Polruan, about my passion for sailing. I'm now looking forward to the sailing season at Fowey.

Balancing my passion for education with the ever growing pressure of the business of partnership.

What is your greatest professional achievement so far?

Offering a country boy from Leicestershire life in a very swinging 60s Kensington and joining London University Officers Training Corps.

If you could have done any other job for just one day what would it have been?



David Mason (Associate Fellow)

How are you connected to UCEM?

I graduated from the MSc Building Surveyor programme in 2017, which I studied for whilst working as a Project Manager. During my time at the institution I also served as the Lead Student Representative and was also the first student to be appointed to the Board of Trustees.

What are you doing now?

I am currently employed as the Head of Projects and Estate Management at The University of Winchester.

What's the biggest challenge you faced in your career?

Responding to COVID-19 has undoubtedly been the biggest challenge in my career to date. As a traditional University our whole method of operation changed overnight, which required almost a full reset in how we do things. My team was responsible for leading in ensuring the campus was COVID safe, undertaking assessments with every area of the business to ensure their spaces and methods of operation met the constantly

changing guidance. During this time I also acted as Centre Manager for the on campus COVID testing facility and led in the decanting of our student residences to turn them over to NHS staff in the neighbouring hospital.

What is your greatest professional achievement so far?

Assisting with the delivery of the West Downs Centre, a new landmark university building in Winchester, has been incredibly rewarding the last few years. The building has already been awarded a national civic trust award, is currently under consideration by RIBA and we hope it will be the first WELL accredited university building in the UK which pairs well with BREEAM excellent status. My recent promotion to the Head of Projects and Estate Management was also an obvious professional high point.

What is your best memory of UCEM?

Graduation has to be up there alongside being shortlisted for an academic excellence award. But I am also incredibly proud of my time working for the university and on the Board. Being given the privilege of becoming an Associate Fellow has only enabled me to continue gathering great memories in connection with UCEM, which really is a fantastic institution. I am also just about to send my first-degree apprentice to the institution, which feels areat

Efficient, inclusive and welcoming.
