UCEM update



Our strategic aim to become the **Centre of Excellence for Built Environment Education** remains our core focus, as well as working to become the world's most sustainable university. We are working hard to bring greater **depth** to our programme offering to support this ambition and intend to launch a new MSc programme in autumn 2023. We look forward to bringing you more information on this exciting development in a future edition. We are also increasing our activities to **influence** both higher education and industry. Our aim is to demonstrate leadership by drawing together the priorities of the largest and most influential bodies within the education sector and wider industry through a series of strategic thought-leaderships events to be launched at the end of 2022.

In other institutional news, UCEM learnt its **National Student Survey** 2022 results in early July, scoring 74.88% for overall student

satisfaction - a marginal increase on our 2021 score. We look forward to building on this further in 2022-23. We continue to forecast a healthy financial outturn for the year despite the gloomy economic outlook in the UK. Our application for **Indefinite Degree Awarding Powers** remains in progress. The desk-based assessment by the Quality Assurance Agency was completed and the final judgement of the Office for Students is expected in August. Our aim is for this to mark the first step in our journey towards full **University Title** and we thank all of you who responded to our recent survey about the potential change of name we might adopt in the future. The Board of Trustees is assessing the feedback this summer and considering the next steps that should be taken.

The **Board of Trustees** had its latest meeting in on 7th July 2022 and was delighted to appoint three new Trustees to the Board. **Gareth Ralphs**,

Partnerships Manager (Southeast) for the Department for International Trade / Head of Policy and Inward Investment for the Thames Valley Chamber of Commerce and a UCEM alumnus, became an Independent Trustee and will bring great knowledge and expertise to the Board, as well as an influential network of contacts. Joe Orrell became our sixth ever Student Trustee. He will replace Muhammad Ahmed who left us this summer and will work alongside the other Student Trustee Grant Alexander over the coming year. Joe is an Apprentice on the BSc Building Surveying route and works as an Apprentice Building Surveyor for Workman LLP. Finally, we also appointed a new Staff Trustee to work alongside Helen Edwards until her term ends in December. **Harps Kaur** is UCEM's Student Lifecycle Officer and will bring great insight to the Board on our operations in student facing teams.

We have been very active as a staff community in the last quarter as we continue to return to more normal operations. In addition to running our regular Feed Me Friday events, we held a Platinum Staff BBQ event at Shinfield Grange on what was to date the hottest day of the year back in June which was a wonderful opportunity to socialize together again and enjoy delicious food, ice cream and fun activities. We have also been supporting staff through events held for Mental Health Awareness Week such as Wellbeing Bingo, through participating in 30 Days Wild, and we once again managed to field a few teams for the JLL Property Triathlon at Dorney Lake!

Finally, we were delighted to see so many of you at the Honorary Community Luncheon held at Founders Hall in London on 25th May 2022. It was such a delight to be together again after two years disrupted by Covid-19 and we were thrilled to finally present some of our Associate Fellows with their certificates. Thank you all for attending and we look forward to seeing you again at the next one in 2023 or at the Property Award in October.

The Honorary Awards community

In this edition we meet Andrew Baum,
Honorary Doctorate recipient in 2021,
and Jane Henshaw, one of our first
Associate Fellow appointees from 2019.
We asked them both some questions to
help us get to know them and learn more
about their connection to UCEM.

Andrew Baum (Honorary Degree recipient)

How are you connected to UCEM?

In spring 1970, I was a Loughborough comprehensive school sixth form student aged 16 and was being interviewed at Kings College London for an undergraduate place to study law. I remember it clearly, and the experience put me right off doing a law degree. That summer, I worked as a trainee for Leicester City Estates Department and must have liked the work, because by September I was living in digs in Wandsworth and commuting by bus to St Albans Grove for my first year of the BSc in Estate Management, which had accepted me through the clearing scheme. Little did I know that later in my life I would become a CEM board member and the recipient of an honorary UCEM doctorate.

What are you doing now?

I still teach MBAs and executives at Said Business School and other universities and run a limited number of customised training sessions. I am chairman of Newcore Capital, a fund manager specialising in UJK social infrastructure. I advise a small number of established property businesses, a proptech VC investor and a larger number of startups.

What's the biggest challenge you faced in your career?

Trying to manage an academic department.

Setting up and selling a couple of companies was easy by comparison.

What is your greatest professional achievement so far?

I think this might be establishing the property research team at Prudential, 1987-1990, because it changed the way property investment decisions were made; or starting the Reading Real Estate Foundation in 2002 with the help of several CEM/Reading graduates, because this led to lots of money being raised to support education and in particular Pathways to Property, which aims to widen access to the real estate profession.

What is your best memory of UCEM?

There are many but they are fading! I remember winning the CEM table football tournament in 1971 with Gary Sams, who became my co-author (Statutory Valuations) many years later. I was sports rep for the students union in 1971-2 and this meant I got an invite to the president's 21st black tie birthday party at a big house in Surrey, to which I wore a black funeral tie, because I didn't understand the code (but I still had a good time). There are others I'd be best advised not to mention, including the Kings Road beer race of 1972.

What three words sum up UCEM for you?

Inclusiveness, impact, ambition

How are you connected to UCEM?

In 2015 I enrolled for the MBA in Construction and Real Estate, and since graduating I have been appointed as an Associate Fellow and also received the Academic Excellence award in 2018.

What are you doing now?

I am responsible for delivering a development programme, circa £500m in construction value for Cadogan, a family owned property company in Chelsea. Current larger projects include a transformational £45million public realm project to ensure Sloane Street is one of the world's best luxury shopping destinations, a £100m mixed use development scheme on the King's Road which will deliver a large art house Curzon cinema, pub and rooftop bar, Waitrose, community retail, residential and office space and a beautiful hotel in partnership with a Parisienne hotel operator which should have a real impact on Sloane Square's elegant 'café culture'.

What's the biggest challenge you faced in your career?


